

# One skein chenille Bunny



This is One skein chenille Bunny pattern, a super cute bunny to make with just one ball of yarn! It's a quick project and easy to make. It's made with a super soft chenille yarn and cotton yarn.

Have fun crocheting!

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### **Pattern info**

This pattern info can be applied in part or in full to all the patterns designed by Swecraftcorner.

Please read the whole pattern before starting to make sure you have an understanding of how the item is made and if there are anything to consider before starting.

Check your gauge and if needed go up or down a size on your hook.

Your gauge is checked by making a square with the stitch used in the pattern, how many you will start with is usually written in the pattern and then for as many rows as written. If your square is bigger than 10x10cm (4"x4") you may need to adjust your hook size to a smaller size and if it's smaller you may need to go up in size. If your gauge is still inaccurate you may need to consider trying another yarn.

When choosing yarn for a pattern I have designed please keep in mind that the same type of yarn can vary in thickness between color batches.

The finished product may vary in size even if your gauge check was spot on. This can happen for a number of reasons. If you are working on your project over several days you may use different tensions when crocheting. For example I always make the soles of slipper or shoes on the same day and even in the same sitting because something as simple as changing my position can mean that I crochet harder. And if I have had a bad or a good day this can also affect how much tension I use while crocheting.

In most patterns you will find the number of stitches you should have when each row or round is finished written within brackets (-).

If not otherwise stated when a number of chains is used to start a round or turn a row these does not count as a stitch. You will therefore have to make your first stitch directly below your chains. See pictures below. (These pictures are from another pattern and is just shown as an example) if the pattern you are currently working on is crocheted in rounds it may look a bit different.

If a round is finished by a slip stitch you will, if not otherwise stated, make the first stitch of the next round in the same stitch as your slip stitch.

Each time you will make a different stitch or number of stitches change it is shown by a , . For example: 1 sc, 2sc in next st, 1 sc in 4 sts. Means that you will make 1 single crochet in your first stitch, in your next stitch you will make 2 single crochets in the same stitch, and in the next four stitches you will make 1 single crochet in each separate stitch.

When a sequence of stitches are repeated these are written within \* - \* and the total number of times the sequence is repeated is written after.

If the instructions for several sizes are written on the same row the specific number of stitches for each size are separated with /, if there are no / on a row in such a pattern the numbers apply to all sizes.

If you have any trouble with a pattern designed by Swecraftcorner please feel free to reach out and I will do my best to help you.

## **Terms (standard US)**

These are the terms I use when I'm making my patterns. Some stitches may have more names than one out in the crochet world but these are the one's I'm using.

Ch - Chain

Ch-sp - chain space

Ch2 space - the space made from chaining 2 the previous row

Sl st - slip stich

St/sts - stitch/stitches

Sc - Single crochet

Hdc - Half double crochet

Dc - Double crochet

Sk - Skip

Mr - Magic ring

Vsc – Waistcoat single crochet

Vhdc - Waistcoat half double crochet

Sc2tog - Single crochet two together (decrease)

Hdc2tog - Half double crochet two together (decrease)

Dc2tog - Double crochet two together (decrease)

2sc - two single crochets in the same stitch (increase)

2hdc - two half double crochets in the same stitch (increase)

2dc - two double crochets in the same stitch (increase)

Sc3tog - Single crochet three together (decrease)

Hdc3tog - Half double crochet three together (decrease)

Dc3tog - Double crochet three together (decrease)

3sc - three single crochets in the same stitch (increase)

3hdc - three half double crochets in the same stitch (increase)

3dc - three double crochets in the same stitch (increase)

*Fpsc - Front post single crochet*

*Fphdc - Front post half double crochet*

*Fpdc - Front post double crochet*

*Front post are made around the post of the previous round from the front of your work (right side of work facing you, hook inserts from the front)*

*Bpsc - Back post single crochet*

*Bphdc - Back post half double crochet*

*Bpdc - Back post double crochet*

*Back post are made around the post of the previous round from the back of your work (right side of work facing you hook inserts from the back)*

*Back loop - Back loop refers to the two loops you see when looking at your stitches from the top. The back loop is the loop that is facing away from you*

*Front loop - Front loop refers to the two loops you see when looking at your stitches from the top. The Front loop is the loop that is closest to you*

## **Materials**

Yarn: 1 skein [chenille yarn](#), a small amount of [cotton yarn](#) for the nose

Hook: 2,5mm, 4,0mm, 6,0mm

Toy filling

Safety eyes approx. 14-18mm

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## **Body**

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Using chenille yarn and a 4,0mm crochet hook.

Make a magic ring.

1. 8sc in mr (8), pull the ring closed
2. 2sc in each st (16)
3. \*1 sc, 2sc in the next st\* x 8 (24)
4. \*1 sc in 2 sts, 2sc in the next st\* x 8 (32)
5. 1 sc in each st (32)
6. 1 sc in each st (32)
7. 1 sc in each st (32)
8. 1 sc in each st (32)
9. 1 sc in each st (32)
10. 1 sc in 11 sts, \*1 sc in the next st, sc2tog\* x 7 (25)
11. 1 sc in 14 sts, \*sc2tog\* x 5, 1 sc (20)
12. 1 sc in each st (20)

**13.** \*1 sc in 2 sts, sc2tog\* x 5 (15)

**14.** 1 sc in each st (15)

**15.** \*1 sc, sc2tog\* x 5 (10) Finish with a sl st into your next st.

Cut the yarn and leave a piece long enough to sew the head to the body.

Stuff the body firmly.

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## Legs

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Using chenille yarn and a 4,0mm crochet hook.

Make 2.

Make a magic ring.

**1.** 6sc in mr (6), pull the ring closed

**2.** 2sc in each st (12)

**3.** \*1 sc, 2sc in the next st\* x 6 (18)

**4.** 1 sc in each st (18)

**5.** 1 sc in each st (18)

**6.** 1 sc in each st (18)

**7.** \*1 sc, sc2tog\* x 6 (12)

**8.** \*1 sc in 4 sts, sc2tog\* x 2 (10)

**9.** 1 sc in each st (10)

**10.** 1 sc in each st (10)

**11.** 1 sc in each st (10)

**12.** 1 sc in each st (10)

Stuff the foot firmly, do not stuff the leg.

To close the leg, pinch the top together and make 1 sc through both sides (5)

Cut the yarn but leave a piece long enough to sew the leg to the body.

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## **Arms**

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Using chenille yarn and a 4,0mm crochet hook.

Make 2.

Make a magic ring.

**1.** 6sc in mr (6), pull the ring closed

**2.** 2sc in each st (12)

**3.** 1 sc in each st (12)

**4.** 1 sc in each st (12)

**5.** \*1 sc in 2 sts, sc2tog\* x 3 (9)

**6.** Sc2tog, 1 sc in 7 sts (8)

**7.** 1 sc in each st (8)

**8.** 1 sc in each st (8)

**9.** 1 sc in each st (8)

**10.** 1 sc in each st (8)

Stuff the hand firmly, do not stuff the arm.

To close the arm, pinch the top together and make 1 sc through both sides (4)

Cut the yarn but leave a piece long enough to sew the arm to the body.

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## **Tail**

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Using chenille yarn and a 4,0mm crochet hook.

Make a magic ring.

1. 6sc in mr (6), pull the ring closed
2. 2sc in each st (12)
3. 1 sc in each st (12)
4. Sc2tog x 6, sl st into next st.

Cut the yarn but leave a piece long enough to sew the tail to the body.

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## Ears

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Using chenille yarn and a 6,0mm crochet hook.

Make 2.

Make a magic ring.

1. 6sc in mr (6), pull the ring closed
2. 2sc in each st (12)
3. 1 sc in each st (12)
4. \*1 sc, 2sc in the next st\* x 6 (18)
5. 1 sc in each st (18)
6. 1 sc in each st (18)
7. 1 sc in each st (18)
8. 1 sc in each st (18)
9. 1 sc in each st (18)
10. 1 sc in each st (18)
11. \*sc2tog, 1 sc in 7 sts\* x 2 (16)
12. 1 sc in each st (16)
13. \*sc2tog, 1 sc in 6 sts\* x 2 (14)
14. 1 sc in each st (14)

**15.** \*1 sc in 2 sts, sc2tog\* x 3, 1 sc in 2 sts (11)

**16.** Sc2tog, 1 sc in 9 sts (10)

**17.** 1 sc in each st (10)

**18.** 1 sc in each st (10)

**19.** 1 sc in each st (10)

**20.** 1 sc in each st (10)

To close the ear, pinch the top together and make 1 sc through both sides (5)

Cut the yarn but leave a piece long enough to sew the ear to the head.

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## Nose

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Using cotton yarn of your choice and a 2,5mm crochet hook.

Make a magic ring.

**1.** Make 1 sc, 2 hdc, 1 sc, 2 hdc in your mr, pull the ring closed

**2.** 2sc in the first st, 2hdc in the next 2 sts, 2sc in the next st, 2hdc in 2 sts (12)

**3.** \*1 sc, 2 sc in the next st\* x 6 (18)

**4.** 1 sc in each st (18) Make a sl st into the next 2 sts

Cut your yarn but leave a piece long enough to sew the nose to the head.

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## Head

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Using chenille yarn and a 4,0mm crochet hook.

Make a magic ring.

**1.** 6sc in mr (6), pull the ring closed

**2.** 2sc in each st (12)

3. \*1 sc, 2sc in the next st\* x 6 (18)
4. \*1 sc in 2 sts, 2sc in the next st\* x 6 (24)
5. \*1 sc in 3 sts, 2sc in the next st\* x 6 (30)
6. 1 sc in 10 sts, \*2sc in the next st, 1 sc in 2 sts\* x 6, 1 sc in 2 sts (36)
7. 1 sc in each st (36)
8. 1 sc in each st (36)
9. 1 sc in each st (36)
10. 1 sc in each st (36)
11. \*1 sc in 4 sts, sc2tog\* x 6 (30)
12. \*1 sc in 3 sts, sc2tog\* x 6 (24)
13. \*1 sc in 2 sts, sc2tog\* x 6 (18)
14. \*1 sc, sc2tog\* x 6 (12)

Insert your safety eyes approx. between round 4 and 5 for smaller eyes or 5 and 6 for bigger eyes (or in place of your choosing). I have approx. 6 sts between.

Stuff the head firmly, sew the nose in place over the first and part of the second round of the face.

If you want to give the bunny character, you can use some white chenille yarn to make some details around the eyes. Use the same colored chenille yarn as your bunny to make some eyebrows.

Tie every loose end together at the back of the head and push the threads into the head before making the final round.

15. Sctog x 6 (6)

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## Assemble the Bunny

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Sew the head to the body with the bunny's small belly facing forward.

Sew the legs between round 5 and 6 of the body.

Sew the arms 1 round below the head.

Sew the tail where you want it to be.

Sew the ears to the head. I have approx. 6 sts left on the top of the head between the ears and I begin after the 8th round of the head.

**Make sure all your ends are secure!**
